Court Reporter Comments from PUBLIC MEETING 2 Range of Alternatives - October 27, 2011

Comment Number	Summary of Comments
1	I am concerned about the Landers Yard expansion, where they are putting a third track for the Norfolk and Southern line. It's my understanding that they are going to put a third line in and a chain link fence on the railroad property. I go out once a month and clean up all the garbage along the tracks. Most comes from railroad employees throwing garbage out of trains and work vehicles. I'm concerned that if a fence is put up, all the garbage will lay there. The railroad has never cleaned it up, and it's left to the residents to do it. If we don't have access to the property, I hope the railroad will clean it up. In addition, I have planted a Native Planting along the border of my property and the railroad property. It's certified with the National Wildlife Federation as wildlife habitat. If they are going to put this fence along the tracks, why not plant native plantings along the whole route. Please come to my property to see what I've accomplished on city/railroad
2	property. I want to commend the organizers for having this public forum.
3	Train noise behind my house is horrible. I don't understand why they blow horns at 2 or 3 a.m.
4	Is the noise we already hear going to be worse? I hear horns blowing in the evening, and I am woken up by them. The trains idle through the night.
5	Dead trees and dying trees on railroad property hang over my house. They need to be removed. I see people breaking into stopped trains and stealing things. Trains are very noisy. When they start up after having been stopped, there is a loud noise. There are hazardous chemicals on trains that require a two-mile evacuation, and I am 60 feet from the tracks. I hope a representative will call me so that we
	can discuss what can be done next.
6	Throughout the city, people working at construction sites resemble the composition of the community, except in the Black community. I am the president of the 18 th Ward, and I have been instrumental in shutting down sites. Current regulations don't result in locals getting construction jobs. For this project, we need to sit down from the beginning, before groundbreaking, before any hiring, before federal funds are allocated, and stipulate that we need minority jobs 100%. We have the noise, the vibration, the pollution, the traffic. When this project starts, I want to see people that look like this community. I'm willing to work with them, but I'll also battle them.
