



Appendix H Environmental Resources Documentation

This appendix presents the documentation of the natural resources survey and clearance activities that were completed as part of the study. This documentation consists of:

- ◆ Letter dated June 3, 2010, from the Illinois Department of Agriculture, in response to a May 14, 2010 letter from the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) providing notice of their intent to prepare an EIS for the 75th Street Corridor Improvement Project (CIP);
- ◆ Memorandum dated June 23, 2010, from the IDOT Bureau of Design and Environment Natural Resources Unit, documenting the review of the project area by that office and the Illinois Department of Natural Resources (IDNR). The IDNR Natural Resources Review Tool and the National Wetland Inventory (NWI) mapping covering the project area were consulted in the review.
- ◆ IDOT Bureau of Design and Environment CREATE Environmental Survey Request (ESR) Addendum Biological and Wetland Resources clearance, dated December 16, 2011. This review covered the entire 75th St. CIP ESR area, including the new areas added by the ESR Addendum request of December 7, 2011.
- ◆ IDOT Bureau of Design and Environment update of Biological Resources Review, dated October 8, 2013.
- ◆ IDOT Bureau of Design and Environment ESR Addendum B, Biological and Wetland Resources clearance, dated January 30, 2014. This review covered the entire 75th St. CIP ESR area, including the new areas added by the ESR Addendum request of January 11, 2014.
- ◆ Letter dated March 6, 2014, from the Illinois Department of Transportation's Cultural Resources Unit in response to ESR Addendum B. The letter documents a finding of no impacts to historical, archaeological, or architectural properties that warrant National Register consideration and concurrence from the Deputy State Historic Preservation Officer.

The Illinois Department of Agriculture (IDOA) is in receipt of the May 14, 2010 correspondence which states that the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT), in cooperation with the Federal Railroad Administration, will reconfigure freight and Metra tracks to reduce rail conflicts with city streets and other rail lines. An Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) is being prepared for the proposed transportation improvements located along the 75th Street Corridor on the south side of Chicago. IDOA comments have been requested pertaining to the information gathering phase for the EIS.

This project involves reconfiguring the tracks of the Belt Railway of Chicago (BRC), Norfolk Southern (NS), CSX, Union Pacific (UP) and Metra's SouthWest Service in the City of Chicago with possible construction of grade separations of rail lines from other rail lines and city streets. Six alternatives are being evaluated to address conflicts between CSX, BRC, UP, NS and Metra in the EIS.

Alternatives under consideration include the No Action and 5 Action (Build) proposals. Associated signals, tracks, crossovers and bridge work are included in the project. Most of the action alternatives being studied will occur entirely within existing rail right-of-way. However, approximately 20-25 homes may be purchased in a low-income, minority residential area under Alternative 5.

Because this project will occur entirely within the urbanized area of Chicago and agricultural land is not involved, it is exempt from further review in accordance with Section 2.c of the IDOA-IDOT Cooperative Working Agreement on the protection of Illinois farmland. The IDOA would consider such an action to be consistent and in compliance with Illinois' Farmland Preservation Act.



Resource in Vicinity of Project Polygon





Review for Illinois Endangered Species Protection and Illinois Natural Areas Preservation – Part 1075
